Color Line, the Reflection of Blacks-Whites Relation in American South: An Analysis of Hughes' *Mulatto*

Abstract

This article attempts to analyze Hughes' *Mulatto*, a play which depicts the problems of racial segregation in American South in the beginning of 20th century. The focus of the problems lies on the relation between Whites and Blacks. The analysis shows that there are two problems seen in the play, i.e. Blacks – Whites inequality and Whites' humiliation against Blacks.
