1. Language Component including

 - Individual consultation
3. Individual Study and Research Component *including*

 - Visits to South West College of Technical and Further Education and the Rural Industries Skills Training College in Hamilton.
4. Cultural Component *including*
 - Visit to Melbourne Immigration Museum
 - Field trip to Hamilton that included visits to Brambuk Aboriginal centre in the Grampians and Ballygunin sheep station in Western Victoria.
5. Conference Paper and Presentation
 - At the commencement of the program all students were invited to present a paper about their research at the School of Management Graduation Conference in December 2008. In addition to RMIT staff, this conference was attended by staff from the Graduate School of UNY. The conference served as a focus for the Language and Research components of the program.
